Registration

Registration is on line at eagledistrict.org. Click on the Camporee link and add the requested information. **Registration deadline is March 27, 2010.**

Fees

Fees will be \$2.00 per person payable at check-in. The fee will cover the cost of patches and awards.

Uniform

Scouts are encouraged to wear Class A uniforms during flag ceremonies and campfire events. Class B uniforms may be worn during the service project and skills events. We will go directly from the opening flag ceremony on Saturday morning to the service project. You may want to bring you Class B clothes with you to change into.

Check-in

Friday April 9, 2010 5:00 – 8:30PM. The Senior Patrol Leader and the Scoutmaster will be the only two individuals to come in to the check-in office, which will be at the main office after you come in the front gate. At check-in present your tour permit and turn in a completed Unit Roster. Vehicles can be used to transport equipment to the campsite then they must be brought back to the check-in area and parked (trailers may be left at the campsites). Campsites will be assigned at check-in on a first come first served basis and unit size.

Check-out

The unit is ready to check out when all their gear is packed and the campsite is free of any litter. Check-out will be at the same office where you checked in. At the office please turn in your

camporee evaluation forms from both the youth and the adults. You will then be given patches for each youth and adult noted on your sign-in roster.

Service Project

One of the core values of scouting is service. We will devote time during the camporee to do a general clean up around campsites and reconstructing some of the trails. Trail reconstruction will consist of building steps on steeper portions of the trail above and below the OA hut and clearing some undergrowth to build a new trail. We will be cutting landscape timber and railroad ties for the steps and installing gravel to level out areas between the steps (these materials will be supplied by the camp). We will need several chain saws that will be operated by adults only. If you have someone in your unit that can bring one, please do so. Units should also bring shovels, loppers/pruners, hoes, and sledge hammers, and gloves. Assignments and instructions will be given as to where the projects are located at the SPL/Scoutmaster meeting on Friday night.

Station Activity

Each troop is requested to prepare at least one activity station for the patrol competitions on Saturday. If you have a larger troop, you can prepare more than one station. The activity will be manned by adults from the troop so the youth are free to go with their patrols and participate in the events. Some suggested activities are listed on the website where you will register your unit. Please select one of the activities or insert your own. You will be responsible for bringing all of the materials that you need to run the activity. Please have a score sheet that you can track each patrol's ranking based on time, points or other metric that applies to the skill. Recognition will be given to the top three patrols in each event.

Cracker barrel

To keep registration costs to a minimum, each troop should bring, at check-in the following:

- 1 box of crackers
- 1 lb of block meat (summer sausage, bologna, etc)
- 1 lb of block cheese (cheddar, pepper-jack, Colby, etc)
- 1 package of cookies
- 1 2 liter bottle of soft drink or juice

Movie

There will be a selection of movies to watch on Friday evening after the cracker barrel. At check in, the senior patrol leader will vote on the movie he would like to see and the movie with the highest number of votes will be shown.

Awards will be given at the campfire for:

Winners of patrol competitions

Best Patrol Flag

Best Overall Campsite

Other awards may be presented as well.

Campfire

There will be a special campfire program planned by the Order of the Arrow in keeping with the theme of Traditions of Scouting. Also, **each scout troop will be asked to present a short skit and song during at the program.** Please turn in what you plan to do when you check in. The skit and song will be previewed by the representatives of the OA prior to its presentation.
